



BOOK PUBLICATION: LEGAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT OF BREXIT CALL FOR PAPERS

The Brexit process has created significant legal uncertainty in all aspects of EU-UK relations and in their respective dealings with third countries. To contribute to the search for the best solutions in the complex negotiation phase, Lexxion Publisher is providing a platform to analyse the impact of Brexit in specific sectors of substantive law.

While the procedural and constitutional aspects of Brexit have received the attention of experts, the discussion of the impact on concrete legal sectors has been limited and scattered. To address this gap, Lexxion is seeking legal impact assessments of selected sectors of EU law. The best contributions will be published (late 2018) in a book under the working title '**Legal Impact Assessment of Brexit: Sectorial Perspectives**'.

Content and Form

We invite authors to submit contributions on the sectoral impact of Brexit in the following areas of substantive law:

- Chemicals law
- Competition law
- Data protection and privacy law
- Financial services
- Food law
- Pharmaceutical law
- Public procurement and Public-private partnership law
- State aid law
- Trade law

Authors can apply discretion regarding the focus of their article but we require that all submitted contributions include an assessment of what a **soft and hard Brexit scenario** would entail for the specific sector. The suggested length of each contribution is **8,000-10,000 words (incl. footnotes)**.

The selection of the contributions will be conducted in a three-step process: 1) initial editorial screening of all submissions, 2) double blind peer review of the short-listed articles, 3) final editorial selection before acceptance for publication. Submissions are required to conform to the OSCOLA reference style and be in Word format.

Deadline for Submission

- 9 May 2018

The authors of the selected papers will be notified of their acceptance by 1 July 2018 and might be requested to revise their contributions according to the peer reviewers' feedback. The revision round will take place in July.
